### The First Antiphon

Bless the Lord, O my soul; blessed art Thou, O Lord. \* Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me bless His holy name. \* Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all that He hath done for thee. \* Who is gracious unto all thine iniquities, Who healeth all thine infirmities. \* Who redeemeth thy life from corruption, Who crowneth thee with mercy and compassion. \* Who fulfilleth thy desire with good things; thy youth shall be renewed as the eagle's. \* The Lord performeth deeds of mercy, and executeth judgment for all them that are wronged. \* He hath made His ways known unto Moses, unto the sons of Israel the things that He hath willed. \* Compassionate and merciful is the Lord, long-suffering and plenteous in mercy. \* Not unto the end will He be angered, neither unto eternity will He be wroth. \* Not according to our iniquities hath He dealt with us,

*\*This is how it is sung on Sundays, but on weekdays sing "Who art wondrous in the saints", unless it is a feast of the Theotokos, in which case we sing "through the prayers of the Theotokos". If it is a great feast of the Lord, we sing the appointed Entry Verse, or "Introit".*

Troparia & Kontakia

[The appointed Troparia and Kontakia of the day] [See Supplemental Handout with Variables]

*Then:*

**Priest:** For holy art Thou, O our God, and unto Thee do we send up glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever: (If a deacon serve, the priest stops here; if a priest serve alone, he continues: and unto ages of ages.)

**Deacon:** O Lord, save the pious and hearken unto us.

**Choir:** O Lord, save the pious and hearken unto us.

*If there is no deacon, "O Lord, save the pious..." is omitted.*

*Choir:* Amen.

Trisagion\*

*\*When "as many as have been baptized..." or "Before Thy Cross..." are appointed, they are sung in place of the Trisagion.*

Holy God, Holy mighty, Holy Immortal have mercy on us. (x3)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen. Holy Immortal have mercy on us.

## The Epistle

**Deacon or Priest:** Let us attend.

**Priest or Bishop:** Peace be unto all.

**Reader:** And to thy spirit.

**Deacon or Priest:** Wisdom!

**Reader:** The Prokimenon in the \_\_\_ Tone: *(And he gives the words of the Prokimenon. The Choir chant it.)*

**Reader:** Stichos. *The Choir repeat the Prokimenon.*

**Reader:** In the \_\_\_ Tone: *(And he gives the second prokimenon.) (Or, if there be only one prokimenon, he may give a second stichos; otherwise he will give the first half of the prokimenon, and Choir chant the second half.)*

**Deacon or Priest:** Wisdom!

**Reader:** The Reading from:-(the Acts of the Holy Apostles, or: the catholic Epistle of N., or: the Epistle of the holy Apostle Paul to the N.)

**Deacon or Priest:** Let us attend.

**Reader:** *If it be from the Acts: In those days...*

*If it be from the Epistles of St. John: Beloved...*

*If it be from the Epistles of St. Paul: Brethren...*

*or: My son Timothy...*

*And when the Epistle is concluded:*

**Priest or Bishop:** Peace be unto thee.

**Reader:** Alleluia in the \_\_\_ Tone. *(If there be two prokimena, he may also give a stichos before the Choir chant the first time.)*

**Choir:** Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

**Reader:** Stichos. *Choir chant second time in same tone.*

**Reader:** In the \_\_\_ Tone: Stichos. *Choir chant final time.*

## The Gospel

**Priest:** Wisdom! Aright! Let us hear the Holy Gospel.

**Priest:** Peace be unto all.

**Choir:** And to thy spirit.

**Priest:** The Reading is from the Holy Gospel according to N.

**Choir:** Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to thee.

**Priest:** Let us attend.

**Then the Gospel is read...**

**Choir:** Glory to Thee, O Lord, glory to Thee.

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### ***The Litany of Fervent Supplication***

**Deacon or Priest:** Let us all say with our whole soul and with our whole mind, let us say.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--O Lord Almighty, the God of our fathers, we pray Thee, hearken and have mercy.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--Have mercy on us, O God, according to Thy great mercy, we pray Thee, hearken and have mercy.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. Thrice.

--Again we pray for our Great Lord and Father, His Holiness, Patriarch *N.*; for our lord the Very Most Reverend Metropolitan *N.*, First Hierarch of the Russian Church Abroad; for our lord the Most Reverend (Archbishop or Bishop *N.*, whose diocese it is) and all our brethren in Christ.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. Thrice. ***Slowly, if there is no Deacon***

--Again we pray for this land, its authorities and armed forces.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. Thrice.

--Again we pray for the God preserved Russian Land and its Orthodox people both in the homeland and in the diaspora and for their salvation.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. Thrice.

--Again we pray to the Lord our God that He may deliver His people from enemies visible and invisible, and confirm in us oneness of mind, brotherly love and piety.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. Thrice.

--Again we pray for our brethren, the priests, priestmonks, and all our brethren in Christ.

**Choir:** Lord have mercy. Thrice.

--Again we pray for the blessed and ever-memorable, holy Orthodox patriarchs; for pious kings and right-believing queens; and for the founders of this holy temple (if it be a monastery: this holy monastery): and for all our fathers and brethren gone to their rest before us, and the Orthodox here and everywhere laid to rest.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. Thrice.

*Here may be inserted various additional petitions, i.e., for the ill and afflicted, the newly-baptized, etc.*

--Again we pray for them that bring offerings and do good works in this holy and all-venerable temple; for them that minister and them that chant, and for all the people here present, that await of Thee great and abundant mercy.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. Thrice.

**Priest:** For a merciful God art Thou, and the Lover of mankind, and unto Thee do we send up glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen.

### **The Litany of the Catechumens**

**Deacon or Priest:** Pray, ye catechumens, to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--Ye faithful, for the catechumens let us pray, that the Lord will have mercy on them.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--That He will catechize them with the word of Truth.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--That He will reveal unto them the Gospel of righteousness.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--That He will unite them to His Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--Save them, have mercy on them, help them, and keep them, O God, by Thy grace.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--Ye catechumens, bow your heads unto the Lord.

**Choir:** To Thee, O Lord. (Slowly, if there be no deacon.)

**Priest:** That they also with us may glorify Thy most honorable and majestic name: of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen.

### **The Litany of the Faithful**

**Deacon or Priest:** As many as are catechumens, depart; catechumens, depart; as many as are catechumens, depart; let none of the catechumens remain; as many as are of the faithful, again and again, in peace let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. (Slowly if there be no deacon.)

--Help us, save us, have mercy on us, and keep us, O God, by Thy grace.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

**Priest:** This American land, its authorities and the faithful that dwell therein, the God-preserved Russian land and its Orthodox people both in the homeland and in the diaspora, may the Lord God remember in His kingdom always, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

The clergy, the monastics, all that are persecuted and suffer for the Orthodox Faith; the founders, benefactors and the brotherhood of this holy temple (or holy monastery), and all of you Orthodox Christians, may the Lord God remember in His kingdom always, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen. That we may receive the King of all, Who cometh invisibly upborne in triumph by the ranks of angels. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

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**Deacon or Priest:** Let us complete our prayer unto the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--For the precious gifts set forth, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--For this holy temple, and for them that with faith, reverence, and the fear of God enter herein, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--That we may be delivered from all tribulation, wrath, and necessity, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. (Slowly, if there be no deacon.)

--Help us, save us, have mercy on us, and keep us, O God, by Thy grace.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--That the whole day may be perfect, holy, peaceful and sinless, let us ask of the Lord.

--Calling to remembrance our most holy, most pure, most blessed, glorious Lady Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary with all the saints, let us commit ourselves and one another and all our life unto Christ our God.

**Choir:** To Thee, O Lord.

**Priest:** Through the compassions of Thine Only-begotten Son, with Whom Thou art blessed, together with Thy most holy, and good, and life-creating Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen.

**Priest:** Peace be unto all.

**Choir:** And to thy spirit.

**Priest or Bishop:** Let us love one another, that with one mind we may confess:

**Choir:** The Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit: the Trinity, one in essence and indivisible.

The Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, / Maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible. / And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, / the Only-begotten, begotten of the Father before all ages; / Light of Light, true God of true God; / begotten, not made; of one essence with the Father, by Whom all things were made; / Who for us men and for our salvation came down from the heavens, / and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became man; / And was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate, / and suffered and was buried; / And arose again on the third day according to the Scriptures; / And ascended into the heavens, and sitteth at the right hand of the Father; / And shall come again, with glory, to judge both the living and the dead; / Whose kingdom shall have no end. / And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of life; Who proceedeth from the Father; / Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; Who spake by the prophets. / In One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. / I confess one baptism for the remission of sins. / I look for the resurrection of the dead, / and the life of the age to come. Amen.

### The Anaphora

**Deacon or Priest:** Let us stand well, let us stand with fear, let us attend, that we may offer the holy oblation in peace.

**Choir:** A mercy of peace, a sacrifice of praise.

**Priest or Bishop:** The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

**Choir:** And with thy spirit.

--Let us lift up our hearts.

**Choir:** We lift them up unto the Lord.

--Let us give thanks unto the Lord.

**Choir:** It is meet and right to worship the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit: the Trinity, one in essence and indivisible.

--Singing the triumphal hymn, shouting, crying aloud and saying:

**Choir:** Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord of Sabaoth; heaven and earth are full of Thy glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

**If it be the Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom:**

--Take, eat: this is My Body, which is broken for you for the remission of sins.

**Choir:** Amen.

--Drink of it, all of you: this is My Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you and for many, for the remission of sins.

**Choir:** Amen.

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**But if it be the Liturgy of St. Basil the Great:**

--He gave it to His holy disciples and apostles, saying: Take, eat: this is My Body, which is broken for you for the remission of sins.

**Choir:** Amen.

--He gave it to His holy disciples and apostles, saying: Drink of it, all of you: this is My Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you and for many, for the remission of sins.

**Choir:** Amen.

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-- Offering unto Thee Thine own of Thine own, in behalf of all and for all.

**Choir:** We praise Thee, we bless Thee, we give thanks unto Thee, O Lord; and we pray unto Thee, O our God.

--Especially for our most holy, most pure, most blessed, glorious Lady Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary.

**If it be the Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom:**

**Choir:** It is truly meet to bless thee, the Theotokos, ever-blessed and most blameless, and Mother of our God. More honorable than the Cherubim, and beyond compare more glorious than the Seraphim, thee without corruption gavest birth to God the Word, the very Theotokos, thee do we magnify.

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**But if it be the Liturgy of St. Basil the Great:**

**Choir:** In thee rejoiceth, O thou who art full of grace, all creation, the angelic assembly, and the race of man; O sanctified temple and noetical paradise, praise of virgins, of whom God was incarnate, and became a child, He that was before the ages, even our God; for, of thy body a throne He made,

He made, and thy womb He made more spacious than the heavens. In thee rejoiceth, O thou who art full of grace, all creation: glory to thee.

Or, on the great feasts, the appointed megalynarion.

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**Priest:** Among the first, remember, O Lord, our Great Lord and Father, His Holiness, Patriarch N.; and our lord the Very Most Reverend Metropolitan N., First Hierarch of the Russian Church Abroad; and our lord the Most Reverend (Archbishop or Bishop N.), whom do Thou grant unto Thy holy churches, in peace, safety, honor, health, and length of days, rightly dividing the word of Thy truth.

**Choir:** And each and every one.

**Priest or Bishop:** And grant us with one mouth, and one heart, to glorify and hymn Thy most honorable and majestic name: of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen.

**Priest or Bishop:** And may the mercies of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ be with you all.

**Choir:** And with thy spirit.

**Deacon or Priest:** Having called to remembrance all the saints, again and again, in peace let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--For the precious Gifts offered and sanctified, let us pray to the Lord

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--That our God, the Lover of mankind, having accepted them upon His holy and most heavenly and noetic altar as an odor of spiritual fragrance, will send down upon us divine grace and the gift of the Holy Spirit, let us pray.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--That we may be delivered from all tribulation, wrath, and necessity, let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy. (Slowly, if there be no deacon.)

--Help us, save us, have mercy on us, and keep us, O God, by Thy grace.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--That the whole day may be perfect, holy, peaceful and sinless, let us ask of the Lord.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

--An angel of peace, a faithful guide, a guardian of our souls and bodies, let us ask of the Lord.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

--Pardon and remission of our sins and offences, let us ask of the Lord.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

--Things good and profitable for souls, and peace for the world, let us ask of the Lord.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

--That we may complete the remaining time of our life in peace and repentance, let us ask of the Lord.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

--A Christian ending to our life, painless, blameless, peaceful, and a good defense before the dread judgment seat of Christ, let us ask.

**Choir:** Grant this, O Lord.

--Having asked for the unity of the faith and the communion of the Holy Spirit, let us commit ourselves and one another and all our life unto Christ our God.

**Choir:** To Thee, O Lord.

**Priest or Bishop:** And vouchsafe us, O Master, with boldness and without condemnation to dare to call upon Thee the heavenly God as Father, and to say:

**Choir:** Our Father, who art in the Heavens,/hallowed be Thy name, Thy Kingdom come,// Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven,/ Give us this day our daily bread,// and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors;/ and lead us not into temptation,// but deliver us from the evil one.

**Priest or Bishop:** For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory: of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen.

--Peace be unto all.

**Choir:** And to thy spirit.

**Deacon or Priest:** Let us bow our heads unto the Lord.

**Choir:** To Thee, O Lord. (Slowly.)

**Priest or Bishop:** Through the grace and compassions and love for mankind of Thine Only-begotten Son, with Whom Thou art blessed, together with Thy most holy, and good, and life-creating Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen. (Slowly.)

**Deacon or Priest:** Let us attend!

**Priest or Bishop:** Holy Things are for the holy.

**Choir:** One is Holy, One is Lord, Jesus Christ, to the glory of God the Father. Amen.

**And the communion hymn.** *The communion verse for most Sundays is: Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.*

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*During the communion of the clergy, selected hymns may be chanted, or the Prayers before Holy Communion may be read. Then:*

**Deacon or Priest:** With fear of God and with faith, draw nigh.

**Choir:** Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord. God is the Lord, and hath appeared unto us.

**Priest or Bishop:** I believe, O Lord, and I confess that Thou art truly the Christ, the Son of the living God, Who didst come into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief. Moreover, I believe that this is truly Thy most pure Body, and that this is truly Thine Own Precious Blood. Wherefore, I pray Thee: Have mercy on me and forgive me my transgressions, voluntary and involuntary, in word and in deed, in knowledge and in ignorance. And vouchsafe me to partake without condemnation of Thy most pure Mysteries unto the remission of sins and life everlasting.

Of Thy Mystical Supper, O Son of God, receive me today as a communicant; for I will not speak of the Mystery to Thine enemies, nor will I give Thee a kiss as did Judas, but like the Thief do I confess Thee: Remember me, O Lord, in Thy kingdom.

Let not the communion of Thy Holy Mysteries be unto me for judgment or condemnation, O Lord, but for healing of soul and body.

*And as each person receiveth Holy Communion, the priest or bishop saith:*

The servant (or handmaid) of God, N., partaketh of the precious and holy Body and Blood of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ unto the remission of sins and life everlasting.

**Choir:** Receive ye the Body of Christ; taste ye of the Fountain of Immortality. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

**Priest or Bishop:** Save O God, Thy people and bless Thine inheritance.

**Choir:** We have seen the True Light, We have received the Heavenly Spirit. We have found the True Faith. We worship the Indivisible Trinity: for He hath saved us.

**Priest or Bishop:** Always, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen. Let our mouth be filled with Thy praise, O Lord, that we may hymn Thy glory, for Thou hast vouchsafed us to partake of Thy holy, divine, immortal and life-creating Mysteries. Keep us in Thy holiness, that we may meditate on Thy righteousness all the day long. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

**Deacon or Priest:** Aright! Having partaken of the divine, holy, most pure, immortal, heavenly, and life-creating, fearful Mysteries of Christ, let us worthily give thanks unto the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--Help us, save us, have mercy on us, and keep us, O God, by Thy grace.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

--Having asked that the whole day may be perfect, holy, peaceful and sinless, let us commit ourselves and one another and all our life unto Christ our God.

**Choir:** To Thee, O Lord.

**Priest or Bishop:** For Thou art our sanctification, and unto Thee do we send up glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen.

**Choir:** Amen.

-- Let us depart in peace.

**Choir:** In the name of the Lord.

**Deacon or Priest:** Let us pray to the Lord.

**Choir:** Lord, have mercy.

### **The Prayer Behind the Ambo:**

**Priest:** O Lord Who dost bless them that bless Thee and sanctify them that put their trust in Thee: Save Thy people and bless Thine inheritance; preserve the fullness of Thy Church, sanctify them that love the beauty of Thy house; do Thou glorify them by Thy divine power, and forsake us not that hope in Thee. Give peace to Thy world, to Thy churches, to the priests, and to all Thy people. For every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from Thee, the Father of lights, and unto Thee do we send up glory and thanksgiving and worship, to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages.

**Choir:** Amen. Blessed be the name of the Lord from henceforth and forever more. *Thrice.*

### **Epistle - 1 Corinthians 1:10-18**

Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment. For it has been declared to me concerning you, my brethren, by those of Chloe's household, that there are contentions among you. Now I say this, that each of you says, "I am of Paul," or "I am of Apollos," or "I am of Cephas," or "I am of Christ." Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, lest anyone should say that I had baptized in my own name. Yes, I also baptized the household of Stephanas. Besides, I do not know whether I baptized any other. For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the gospel, not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of no effect. For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

### **Gospel - Matthew 14:14-22**

And when Jesus went out He saw a great multitude; and He was moved with compassion for them, and healed their sick. When it was evening, His disciples came to Him, saying, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is already late. Send the multitudes away, that they may go into the villages and buy themselves food." But Jesus said to them, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." And they said to Him, "We have here only five loaves and two fish." He said, "Bring them here to Me." Then He commanded the multitudes to sit down on the grass. And He took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, He blessed and broke and gave the loaves to the disciples; and the disciples gave to the multitudes. So they all ate and were filled, and they took up twelve baskets full of the fragments that remained. Now those who had eaten were about five thousand men, besides women and children. Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away.

The dominion of death / can no longer hold men captive, / for Christ descended, shattering and destroying its powers! / Hell is bound, while the prophets rejoice and cry: / "The Savior has come to those in faith! / Enter, you faithful, into the Resurrection!

Holy & Glorious Prophet Elijah, Troparion, Tone IV —

The angel in the flesh, the foundation of the prophets, / the second forerunner of the Coming of Christ, / the glorious Elijah from on High sent down grace upon Elisha / to dispel infirmities and to cleanse lepers. // Wherefore, he poureth forth healings upon them that honor him.

Kontakion, Tone II —

O prophet, foreseer of the mighty works of our God, / Elijah of great renown, / who by thy voice didst restrain the cloud of rain; // in our behalf entreat thou Him that alone is the Lover of mankind.

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
